“Jessamine County re-directs telephone books through recycling program”

If you’ve just received yet another new telephone book and aren’t quite sure what to do with the old ones you have lying about, the Jessamine Convenience Center has the answer: Operation Re-direct, a telephone book recycling program.

Through the program, containers where residents may drop off telephone books for recycling are placed at the Jessamine County Courthouse and City Hall in Nicholasville as well as City Hall in Wilmore.

“New telephone books are traditionally delivered in the spring months, so we offer Operation Re-direct during that time,” said Johnetta Ogden, Convenience Center director.

The program gives residents the opportunity to ensure that their used telephone books do not end up in landfills, or even by the side of the road. Last year, 17.4 tons of phone books were collected county-wide, according to Ogden. “That’s a lot of wood, a lot of trees saved through recycling,” she said.

Recycling containers will be available at the Nicholasville and Wilmore locations through the end of March. After that, residents may still drop off their used telephone books free of charge at the Jessamine County Convenience Center located at 123 Hendren Way, Nicholasville. Convenience Center hours are Mondays, 7:30 a.m. – 6:30 p.m. and on Tuesday – Friday from 7:30 a.m. – 4:00 p.m. For more information, please call 881-4465.
